CONVENTION BUSINESS

The 1965 National Convention produced the largest and most significant legislation in many years. The effects of some of this legislation will be felt throughout the Fraternity for many years to come. Below is a transcript of amendments made to both the ritual and constitution, and resolutions passed at this, Alpha Phi Delta's most historic convention, in the Fifty-first year of the Fraternity.

Legislation Adopted By 1965 National Convention

1. Change in Ritual:

"... keeping inviolate the sanctity of their homes and firesides; I will so live and conduct myself as to bring credit to this Fraternity and reproach upon it; all of which I do hereby swear as a College man of Italian extraction AND/OR ONE WILLING TO ASSIST in spreading all that is good and praiseworthy in Italian Culture, now deemed worthy for membership..."

Approved by National Convention.

2. Article V—Section 1 (page 4 of Constitution) OBLIGATION FOR MEMBERSHIP:

DELETE the word "Badge".

Approved by the National Convention.

Therefore the cost of the fraternity pin is now the responsibility of the new member. Central Office does not have to allow any credit from the initiation tax.

Resolutions Adopted By 1965 National Convention

1. WHEREAS, College campuses and College students have attracted nationwide attention by their promotion or support of various causes, and; WHEREAS, in their zeal to champion their causes, students are guilty of civil disobedience;

BE IT RESOLVED, THEREFORE, that Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity, while supporting any just cause, does not and will not condone any demonstration or otherwise that endangers the public or does not lend itself to the general welfare of the community.

2. WHEREAS, the National Convention of 1965 of Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity is cognizant that certain indiscriminate, sadistic and sometimes uncivilized hazing procedures have been employed by many chapters of our fraternity, hereby officially again condemn said practices as being repugnant to the high ideals of our fraternity as well as principles of good brotherhood;

BE IT RESOLVED, THEREFORE, that Chapters to it be incumbent upon each seriously review their hazing policies and procedure so as to strictly conform to the principles set forth in our National Constitution, as well as, those standards as enumerated by the National Interfraternity Conference. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT, the National Executive Committee be delegated the authority and responsibility for closely supervising and scrutinizing the pledge practice of each Chapter and henceforth impose appropriate disciplinary means for any infraction which they deem repugnant to standards as drawn by them.

3. WHEREAS, the National Convention has elected by vote to delete the word "Badge" from Article V, Section I of the Constitution of Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity and has therefore increased the net revenue received by the Central Office per initiate,

BE IT RESOLVED, THEREFORE, that we recommend that the National Convention instruct Central Office to increase the per diem benefits of the National Delegates by an amount which is economically feasible. Adopted by National Convention.

4. WHEREAS, God in his infinite wisdom, has called from this earth, the many brothers, hereinbefore, mentioned at our Memorial Exercises, lest we forget, and let newcomers who have not heard, we again express our sorrow at the loss of these brothers:

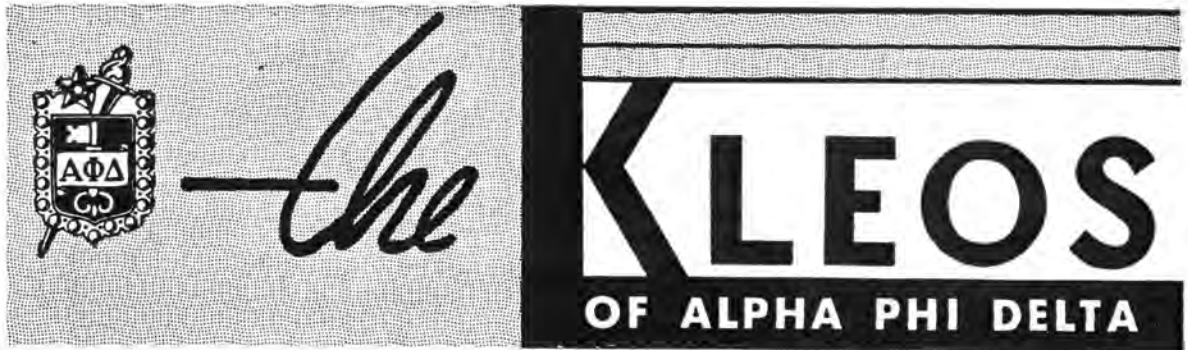
BE IT RESOLVED, THEREFORE THAT: Dr. Frank C. Baratta, Epsilon; Joseph N. Blase, Iota; Thomas M. Cannella, Iota; Dr. George A. Catanzano, Tau; John J. Cucci, Iota; Leo R. Dantona, Tau; Michael Erpino, Iota; James Kendall, Mu; Joseph V. Lojacono, Epsilon; Odo Montesi, Zeta; Anthony Pellegrini, Epsilon; William J. Simone, Xi; J. B. LaGuardia, Beta; Shall Live On As Brothers in our Memories.

5. WHEREAS, the Fraternity expects its duly elected officers to be men of integrity, unselfish and devoted to duty, and;

WHEREAS, Francis J. Paladino has epitomized these qualities as National President for the past year;

BE IT RESOLVED: that this National Convention of Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity express its appreciation to Brother Paladino for a job well done, and express a vote of confidence to him for his future and endeavors.

PROGRESSIVE, HISTORIC LEGISLATION HIGHLIGHT OF APD'S BIGGEST CONVENTION; CHANGES KEYED TO FUTURE; PALADINO, CIARROCCHI, RE-ELECTED

Alpha Phi Delta's Forty-fourth National Convention is now history. Not only was it the Fraternity's largest gathering held thus far but it will be heralded as the Convention that produced the most progressive legislation in thirty years, legislation that shows great promise for the future of APD.

The most important piece of legislation passed by the convention body was the change to the Ritual which establishes Alpha Phi Delta as an American Fraternity formed by men of Italian extraction, but no longer limited thereto, and open to any college man deemed worthy for membership as one who is "willing to assist in spreading all that is good and praiseworthy in Italian Culture."

So much legislation was presented and acted upon at this convention that a rare afternoon session was required to assure that all legislative matters could properly be received and discussed. (Constitutional amendments and resolutions passed are contained in other columns of this issue.)

Most gratifying was the excellent attendance recorded at this Convention. Sixty two delegates were seated with only one chapter not represented. In addition, despite the controversial nature of the legislation, the body conducted itself with excellent decorum and a deep sense of responsibility, fully recognizing the historical importance and effects of its actions upon the nature of Alpha Phi Delta and its future.

Re-elected to a second term to their respective offices at the conclusion of the convention were Francis Paladino, Phi, of Flushing, New York, National President, and Trent Ciarrocchi, Psi, of Weirton, West Virginia, National Vice-president.

Conventioners began gathering early at Tamiment, one of the best appointed of all Eastern resorts. Many arrived the previous weekend and by Monday evening, August 30, the official start of the Convention, a large attendance had already been recorded. Final figures showed over 325 men, women and children in attendance, at least a few over the previous record attendances established last year (the Fiftieth Anniversary Convention at Groton, Connecticut) and at Galen Hall in 1959.

From Monday evening, August 30th, through breakfast Friday, September 3, Alpha Phi Deltans were treated to some of the finest hospitality yet tendered in the fifteen years of resort conventions. The Tamiment's name entertainment program was unusually good, with a different presentation each evening. This included Bobby Ramsen, a stand-up comedian that kept the audience in uproarious laughter for nearly an hour, a variety show, and a Spanish Fiesta dance troupe. Sandwiched in between was APD's own favorite annual Masquerade which this year saw some thirty-five contestants vieing for top costume and entertainment honors.

Unfortunately, the weather was not as accommodating as the management. It rained intermittently for the first two days and it wasn't until Thursday that the sun broke through to reveal the natural beauty of the Pocono area. Weather not withstanding, this did not prevent golf buffs from taking to the greens on which is admittedly one of the finest courses in the East. Many indoor activities and games served to supplement the general outdoor program during the rainfalls.

The convention concluded with a Cocktail party and the traditional Formal Dinner and Dance during which the Fraternity's highest awards were presented. This year's Outstanding Chapter Award went to Beta Pi, St. John's University, Long Island, New York. Most outstanding Undergradu-

ate was Richard F. Gaylord of Beta Theta Chapter, College of Steubenville. Richard has been extremely active on chapter, district and national level ever since his initiation two years ago and promises to be one of APD's brighter young alumni in the near future. Most Outstanding Alumnus was Louis Minutello, Psi, Pittsburgh Alumni Club, a convention regular for several years and one of the backbones of the Fifth District.

General Convention Chairman was

Joseph A. DeGuglielmo, Past National President who also delivered the main address at the Formal Dinner. Convention Chairman for this Forty-fifth official gathering was Past National President Frank Cavallaro who has served in this capacity at several previous affairs and who managed to adhere to a very difficult program with a minimum of frustration. Master of Ceremonies for the program was Adam Di Vincenzo, National Secretary.

The President's Message

Dear Brothers:

I am inclined to accept that the recent National Convention held at Tamiment in the Poconos terminated a fruitful gathering.

Generally the undergraduate delegates let it be known that a new trend has developed. The spirit seemed to suggest more action, greater cooperation, and the decision to advance the ideals of our Fraternity both by word and action.

My personal observations were pleasing to the point of gratification. In the first place, the delegates departed themselves above reproach. Even in the matter of dress, and expression, there was distinction, unusual decor, and an overt expression of conservation prestige. Secondly, all chapters excepting one, were seated. This in itself connotes a serious interest towards the affairs of our fraternity. Thirdly, the manner and the activity of the delegates demonstrated in no uncertain terms that action, and work promises to be the keynote for the future.

Action was the theme; and it pleases me to feel that at long last we have a sensible diagnosis. It follows that proper administration of corrective therapeutics will enable us to direct the fraternity into satisfactory and promising roads of rewards for the general good of all. I know you will not relent. Further, I wish to congratulate the District Governors for their part in this movement. Very likely there is a clear indication that the shackles are slowly being eased off of Central Office.

It is amazing what wondrous things can be accomplished by even a little concerted cooperation. Surely, you must feel as I do that we are launched upon the second half of our century in fraternity history with a dedicated will to do better, and to extend our prestige to a greater and more satisfying goal. We have dedicated ourselves to go forward, and all signs at this past National Convention indicated this GO signal.

BE IT RESOLVED, THEREFORE, that this National Convention express its appreciation to brothers Adam Di Vincenzo and Joseph Scotti, Secretary and Treasurer, respectively for a job well done.
- WHEREAS, this National Convention took many hours of hard work, self sacrifice and expense to plan and inaugurate, and;
WHEREAS, brothers Joseph De Guglielmo, Carlo M. Vannicola, and Frank Cavallaro dedicated themselves to this task freely and in good spirit;
BE IT RESOLVED, THEREFORE, that this National Convention congratulate said brothers for their fine work.
- WHEREAS, Tamiment in the Poconos, Pennsylvania is the site of yet another successful and enjoyable National Convention of Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity, and;
WHEREAS, the management of Tamiment, has contributed to such success;
BE IT RESOLVED, THEREFORE, that this National Convention express its thanks and appreciation to the management of Tamiment in the Poconos.
- WHEREAS, in the year 1936 a Trust was created by agreement between members of the Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity and certain named individuals as Trustees for the purpose of financing the publications of fraternal magazines, periodicals and literature of said fraternity as the dissemination of same among its members as a means of educational enlightenment; and,
WHEREAS, the last official meeting of the Trustees was held in Rochester, New York, on September 1948, by Trustees: Dr. Felix Ottaviano, Anthony Cugino, Carlo M. Vannicola, Frank J. Travaline, Jr., and Anthony D'Aurora; and,
WHEREAS, according to the latest Annual Report of 1965, all of the funds of said Trust are on deposit with the following institutions for a sub-total of \$7,907.57:

Women's Federal	1,098.78
1st Federal—Buffalo	2,426.47
1st Federal—Pittsburgh	1,177.06

and, in addition thereto, \$10,000.00 was advanced as a loan to the Housing Corporation without Resolution and authority of the Trustees and cash on hand in the amount of \$176.00 for a grand total of \$17,672.65, and,

WHEREAS, past of the income of said trust was distributed for the purpose of the Trust aforesaid and balance thereof allowed to accumulate with the principal,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- That all prior acts performed for and in behalf of the trust by the then and now existing Trustees to the present date, be hereby approved, ratified and validated, and all possible claims, rights and actions of the fraternity, or those who are known as donors to said trust, are hereby waived and disclaimed as though all such acts were in perfect conformity with the provisions of the Trust Agreement.
- That the existing Trustees are: Dr. Felix Ottaviano, whose tenure was to have expired in 1949; Anthony D'Aurora in 1950; Frank J. Travaline, Jr., in 1951; Anthony Cugino in 1952 and Joseph V. Scotti who by virtue of his office as National Treasurer succeeded Carlo M. Vannicola in 1960.
- That the Grand Consul, now known as the National President, appoints four successors to the Trustees aforesaid within the terms of the Trust; i.e., are for one year, one for two years, one for three years and one for four years, the fifth Trustee being Joseph V. Scotti, National Treasurer, by virtue of his office.

Recommendation By Central Office To National Convention:

- Raise Initiation Fee from \$30.00 to \$40.00 per initiate.
Approved by National Convention.
- Raise Undergraduate Per Capita from \$6.00 per semester to \$10.00 per semester.
Defeated by National Convention.
- Raise Alumni Per Capita from \$5.00 per year to \$10.00 per year.
Approved by National Convention.

LIFE SUBSCRIBER'S FUND TRUSTEES ELECTED

One of the more significant actions taken by the 45th National Convention body was to accept a resolution proposed by the Special Committee on the Life Subscribers Trust Fund which re-established the intent of the Fund.

The special committee, composed of Victor Leanza, Past National President and Attorney at Law from Cleveland, Ohio, Angelo C. Procopio, Attorney at Law from Pittsburgh, and Carlo M. Vannicola, Past National Treasurer and President did a superb job in studying and explaining the essence of the Fund, the purpose of which is to perpetuate Fraternity publications.

A new board of trustees was then selected by National President Frank Paladino to administer the Fund. They are: Angelo C. Procopio (four year term), Victor Leanza (three year term), Carlo Vannicola (two year term) and Stan Raffa, KLEOS Editor (one year term). National Treasurer Joseph Scotti is the fifth member of the Board by virtue of his office.

The new trustees were approved by the Executive Committee and the delegates in session as provided by the Fund.

NATIONAL CHAPTER HOUSE FOUNDATION MEETS

Not all of the significant action took place on the convention floor. The trustees of the National Chapter House Foundation met the afternoon of August 31st in a four and one-half hour session to review the status of all houses managed by the fund and to consider appeals for new ones.

Latest approved house acquisition is expected to be the Eta House. Third District Governor Armand DeRosa was authorized the expenditure of the sum of \$15,000 (with provisions) toward the purchase of a property located at Hamilton Place in New York City. The purchase, when consummated, represents the second house to be purchased by the Foundation in the metropolitan New York area.

The Foundation also announced that Beta Lambda men would move into their new quarters by the end of September, 1965. The Beta Lambda House, completely new in design and construction, represents the Foundation's largest investment and is expected to set the pattern for future new housing for the Fraternity. It is located right next to the campus of St. Francis College, Loretto, Penna.

The Foundation's six other houses include Pi House, West Virginia University, at Morgantown, W.V., Beta Xi House, Newark College of Engineering, at Newark, New Jersey, Beta Omicron House, Youngstown University, at Youngstown, Ohio, Xi House, Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio, Beta Rho House, Gannon College, at Erie, Penna., and Chi House, Pennsylvania State University, at State College, Penna.

COMMITTEES BIGGEST WORK HORSES OF CONVENTION

Note has already been made of the hard work of the members of the Convention Committee, the National Chapter House Foundation trustees and the Committee for the Life Subscribers Fund. But there were also other hard-working groups, the members of the various standing committees necessary to process the voluminous amount of proposed legislation for presentation to the body. At least three of these committees, the Legislative, Resolutions, and Budget and Audit Committees had to meet at least twice between convention sessions in order to complete their work.

Chairmen of these working committees included Trent Ciarrocchi, National Vice-president, Legislative Committee; Albert Yannon, Sixth District Governor, Resolutions Committee; Ernest Coletti, Second District Governor, Rules of Order Committee; Jules Zangrille, Fifth District Governor, Budget and Audit Committee; and Father Salvatore Federici, National Chaplain, Ritual Committee. Dr. Horace Goffredo served as Parliamentarian, a difficult position to which he has been chosen for the past few years.

At least one committee will continue to be active between conventions, its work never done. This is the Expansion Committee, now chaired by Frank Cavallaro, PNP. Cavallaro had made at least one appointment since the convention, that of Dr. John C. Carrozzella, Gamma, of Wallingford, Connecticut, as Chairman of Expansion for the New Haven Alumni Club. Revival of this club would bring a great many alumni in the area back into the official fold of the Fraternity.

Fraternities At Buffalo Continue Campus Ban Fight

The battle for fraternities at the State University of Buffalo, New York continues. It entered a new phase early in September when attorneys for the campus groups said they would appeal a recent State Supreme Court decision upholding a ban of national fraternities and sororities at the school.

Fraternities and sororities were ordered to sever connections with national organizations after the university, formerly the University of Buffalo, became a part of the State University in 1962. The appeal will seek to overturn a decision of Justice Matthew J. Jasen, of the New York State Supreme Court, who ruled that the ban by the State University Board of Trustees was legal.

The appeal will be based on the grounds that the trustees imposed an unreasonable classification to distinguish between the national and local social fraternities and sororities which perform the same functions, according to the Ralph L. Halpern, counsel for the fraternities. He also indicated that the appeal would be based on earlier testimony of university officials that no discrimination is practiced by the Chapters here and that the officials welcome the existence of the national fraternities and sororities.

At stake here is the national affiliation of five fraternity chapters and two sororities, many of which have been established for many years. For Alpha Phi Delta, this means the existence of Epsilon Chapter, organized in 1921, and the Fraternity's second oldest active.

Attorney Halpern said that the state has agreed to delay enforcement of the appeal. Meanwhile, the fraternities and sororities will continue to pledge new members this fall as usual.

Civill, Nu, Named Magistrate of Pittsburgh

Leonard A. Civill, Nu, has been named Police Magistrate of the City of Pittsburgh, Penna. The appointment was made by Mayor Joseph M. Barr. Civill took his oath of office in an impressive ceremony early this year with Judge Ruggero J. Aldisert in attendance.

Civill, a First Ward Alderman, fills the position created by the provision of an additional city magistrate in Pittsburgh's 1965 budget.

Brother Civill received his bachelor's degree from the University of Pittsburgh and was graduated from Duquesne University Law School. While of U. of P. he was initiated into Nu Chapter of Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity.

After graduation he served as a magistrate's clerk for two years and later became assistant chief clerk in the Bureau of Highways and Sewers. In 1941 he was appointed superintendent of the City Asphalt Plant, a position he held for fifteen years.

He was elected alderman in 1945. In running for his last three terms, he received both the Democratic and Republican nominations. In addition, he served as Democratic Chairman of the First Ward for 16 years. He served as alderman until his recent appointment.

Active in both social and community organizations, Brother Civill is a past president of the Minor Judiciary and Constables Association of Allegheny County and a former vice president of the Squires and Constables Association of Pennsylvania. He was also chairman of the Uptown Redevelopment Committee and in 1964 served as Chairman of the Epiphany R.C. Church Improvement Fund.
