## National Council picks Malecki for President

### Glenn Small chosen Executive V.P.

The National Council of Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity unanimously elected Executive Vice President **Joseph Malecki** (Beta Chi, 1983) as the fraternity's 44th National President at its annual meeting February 19 and 20, 1994, at Richard Stockton College in Pomona, N.J. **Glenn Small** (Beta Xi, 1976), North Jersey District Governor, was also elected unanimously as Alpha Phi Delta 34th Executive Vice President. Their terms begin July 1.

Following Malecki's election as National President, he announced a slate of appointed officers which includes new faces in key positions, including **Matthew Vislocky** (Gamma Iota, 1988) as Vice President for Financial Affairs, **Joseph Hughes** (Gamma Xi, 1988) as V.P. for

*President's Message***Taking inventory of life in Alpha Phi Delta**

Comic strip character Charlie Brown once said, "I thought I had life figured out, but there was a flag on the play." That phrase has often held true in my personal and professional life. I'm not certain if my nearly one dozen years of Executive Committee service to Alpha Phi Delta counts as personal or professional life.

Critics say that it must have been personal because at times I wasn't very professional. That may be so, but I am proud to have been an integral part of the fraternity's accomplishments over the last decade.

I wasn't absolutely convinced that fraternity involvement was necessary as I contemplated life as a Glassboro State College freshman. While sitting in the back of a psychology class, a senior named Steve Farrell mentioned Alpha Phi Delta to me for the first time. So I wandered into a rush meeting later that week and the rest, as they say, is...well, you know what they say about the rest.

At Beta Phi chapter, I served as secretary, vice president and president. In addition, I was elected

VP for Undergraduate Affairs. I received tremendous guidance from two national officers, **Matt LoMonaco** and **Rich Primiano**. Both men showed me how fraternity leadership should be carried out. Each took time to speak with me about their experiences and their recommendations.

My success at Beta Phi was also due to the loyal assistance of a pledge brother, **Jim Bloemker**. The man was always there to lend a hand in carrying out key activities and initiatives.

From there it was on to graduate school and an appointment as VP for Expansion. My long-time lady, **Liz**, became my wife that fall. We moved into a tiny, non-climate controlled attic in Glassboro, where I received a call from a Trenton State College

freshman, **Michael Beshada**. That call led to the start of Gamma Eta chapter. Other triumphs during my expansion tenure were the reactivation of Beta Delta at Temple University and the formation of Gamma Theta at Eastern College (St. David's, Pa.).

National President Primiano asked me to serve as Executive Secretary two years later. That six-year experience brought me deep into Alpha Phi Delta's past, present and future workings.

Central Office, to me, had been a vision of historical documents, dusty memorabilia and drawers and drawers of organizational pride. It was indeed all of those things, although they were not very well organized, maintained or catalogued.

Months of hard work resulted in a proud Central Office open house in May 1988. While never to be confused with the Library of Congress, the Alpha Phi Delta files were organized. Current Executive Secretary **Jim Lentini** has done a remarkable job in taking the office to the next level. Nonetheless, I consider that massive project to be my greatest contribution to this organization.

While working on that project, I developed excellent friendships with men like **Anthony "Butch"**

# Dr. A.U.N. Camera Scholarship Key revived

The Dr. A.U.N. Camera Scholarship Key, an Alpha Phi Delta honor given since 1938 to undergraduate brothers demonstrating high academic achievement, has been revived and was awarded for the first time in more than a decade at the National Council Meeting February 19, 1994.

Executive Secretary **James Lentini** (Beta Sigma, 1981) handed out the awards to brothers recognized by their chapters for academic excellence. The awards were created by the J.O. Pollack company based on the original award design found on file at Central Office.

The award was named for **Dr. A.U.N. Camera** (Eta, 1921), the second National Editor of *The Kleos*, serving from 1933 until his death in 1938.

At the 1938 Summer Convention in Pittsburgh, the Scholarship Committee of Alpha Phi Delta recommended that a scholarship key be created for each chapter to award to its top student, and for a scholarship cup, also named for Dr. Camera, to be awarded to the leading chapter in academics. Rho chapter at Carnegie-Mellon Institute in Pittsburgh in 1939 and Gamma chapter at Yale University in 1940 won the only scholarship cups known to be awarded.

## National Council elects Malecki, Small

Expansion, **Daniel Cimmino** (Gamma Nu, 1990) as V.P. for Public Relations, and **Thomas Carroll, Esq.** (Chi, 1980) as General Counsel. **Stephen Grady** (Beta Phi, 1990) was elected Vice President for Undergraduate Affairs by the Undergraduate Coordinating Committee.

The National Council welcomed two new undergraduate chapters, and one alumni club into the fraternity. At the recommendation of V.P. for Expansion **Howard Beder** (Beta Phi, 1984), the colony at the Newark, N.J., campus of Rutgers University was chartered as Delta Pi chapter and was placed in the North Jersey District. The colony was formed in November 1992. It now has 12 brothers and maintains strong involvement in the North Jersey District and frequent interaction with the Beta Xi chapter at the New Jersey Institute of Technology, which is also in Newark.

The National Council also chartered the colony at Embry Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona, Florida, as Delta Omicron chapter and placed it in the Georgia District. The colony was formed in April 1993 and now has 14 brothers, many of whom are registered pilots. The brothers frequently donate time to a local shelter for runaways and are seeking official recognition from the school administration.

The South Jersey Alumni Club, a group of 28

brothers, received its charter from the National Council. The club held its first monthly meeting in October 1993 and plans several spring activities, including a golf outing and a trip to a Philadelphia Phillies game. It also seeks to assist the chapters in its area: Beta Phi at Rowan College in Glassboro and Gamma Mu at Richard Stockton College.

The National Council voted to close the Gamma Psi chapter at the University of Connecticut and the Mohawk Valley Alumni Club due to inactivity. The National President also suspended recognition of Beta Iota chapter at Utica College in Utica, N.Y.

Petitions on behalf of three candidates for graduate membership were approved. **Victor B. Ciancetta**



was initiated through the Columbus Alumni Club. **Fr. Paul Bocchicchio**, faculty advisor to Delta Xi chapter at Seton Hall University in South Orange, N.J., and **Frank Savino**, Assistant Dean of Student Life at St. John's University in Queens, N.Y., and faculty moderator for Beta Pi chapter, were inducted through those chapters.

Legislation approved by the National Council includes academic requirements for pledges and chapter officers. An amendment to the By-Laws of Alpha Phi Delta requires that a student must have a 2.0 grade point average in order to pledge the fraternity. No member may be elected to chapter office if his GPA is below 2.0. Any member whose GPA falls below 1.0 for a semester shall be placed on probation and barred from chapter activities until his GPA rises above 1.0.

Another amendment requires that all colonies and reactivation projects exist for a full calendar year and have at least seven members before they may be considered for chartering or reactivation. Alumni clubs and associations have the same requirements, but need only exist for six months before chartering. The National Council also approved the requirement that, beginning with the fall semester, an Italian history assignment be given to each pledge. The assignment is to be presented to the Vice President for Cultural Affairs prior to initiation.

The National Council rejected a restructuring which would give each entity only one voting delegate to the National Council rather than two. The proposal was designed to trim the cost of granting travel allowances to delegates who may be traveling as much as 1,000 miles. However, current delegates felt it was impractical to ask them to travel alone.

In other financial matters, the National Council approved a budget which raises annual fees to chapters, alumni clubs and associations. The fee increases are in response to a shortfall in the first six months of the fiscal year and an anticipated rise in insurance costs. The National Council also authorized the Executive Committee, if needed, to evaluate the fee structure, and to make changes contingent on the approval of three-fourths of the officers.

In addition to its importance in conducting the business of Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity, the National Council Meeting has also become the fraternity's most-anticipated social event, bringing together

brothers from nearly every region where Alpha Phi Delta is known. Gamma Mu chapter earned kudos for its hospitality during the weekend. The chapter hosted a variety of post-meeting activities which were enjoyed by undergraduate and alumni delegates alike. National Chaplain **Fr. Ronald Falotico** (Gamma Mu, 1992) also added a spiritual element to this gathering of the National Council by opening each session with prayer and by officiating over a Roman Catholic mass. ■

## Valeriano to chair Foundation board

*The Chapter Eternal***Adam DiVincenzo, 21st National President**

Alpha Phi Delta lost one of its legends with the passing of **Adam DiVincenzo** on February 14, 1994, at the age of 84.

Affectionately and respectfully known as "Mr. Alpha Phi Delta" by many brothers, brother DiVincenzo spent most of his adult life working for the good of our fraternity. Adam was known as a special man, very loyal to the organizations he espoused.

Brother DiVincenzo was initiated into Psi chapter at Duquesne University on February 12, 1932. He went on to become chapter president, as well as president of the Duquesne University Student Senate and the Interfraternity Council. He graduated in 1934 with a B.S. degree in education.

After his college years, brother DiVincenzo's activity in Alpha Phi Delta increased. He served as a District Governor from 1947 to 1952. In 1952 he was elected National President, then called Grand Consul, and served until 1954. In 1955, he was named Alpha Phi Delta's Outstanding Alumnus.

Instead of resting on his record of accomplishments, he accepted an appointment as National Secretary in 1960 and continued in that capacity until 1978, the longest term as Secretary in Alpha Phi Delta's history. His long hours and indefatigable service helped keep

the fraternity alive during the troubled times of the late 1960s. The fraternity honored him again in 1985, this time with a lifetime achievement award.

His love for his Italian heritage inspired him to dedicate his time to the Italian Sons and Daughters of America, for which he served as National Secretary from 1936 to 1950. He was also a fourth degree member of the Knights of Columbus, a member of the Kiwanis Club and St. Elizabeth's Church in Pittsburgh. In 1945 he was recognized by the United States Treasury Department as one of the 1,000 outstanding men in the nation for his efforts in selling war bonds.

Brother DiVincenzo, a regular at Summer Conventions for many years, attended his last convention at Lake Placid in August 1989. Many who were present still remember the eloquent and tearful "Good and Welfare" address he gave, in which he spoke about his great love for Alpha Phi Delta.

Brother DiVincenzo is survived by his wife, Mary, daughter Connie Ann, and grandson Anthony Adam Mascaro.

An effort is underway to dedicate an Alpha Phi Delta scholarship in the name of brother DiVincenzo. To contribute to that fund, contact the Alpha Phi Delta Scholarship Fund, 16 Lehigh St., Dunellen, N.J. 08812. ■

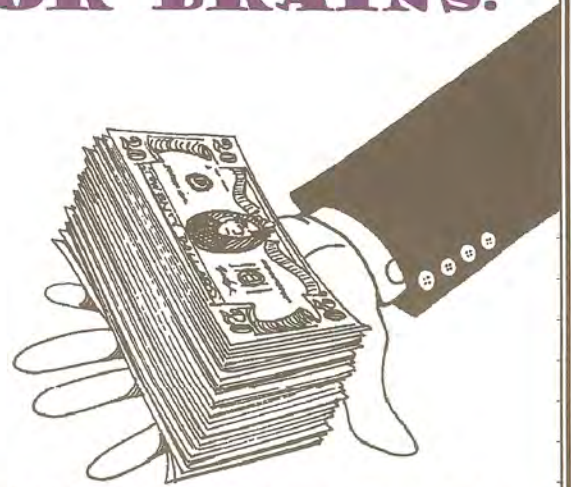

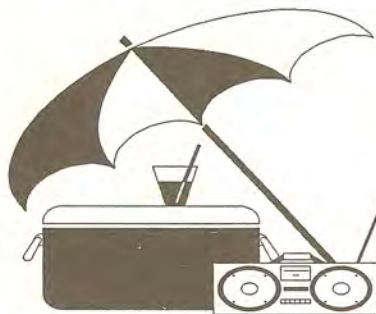
